What do I need to study The Higher Certificate in Christian Ministry?

The Higher Certificate in Christian Ministry provides Christians with foundational and practical training to equip and empower them to build God's kingdom in their sphere of influence.

Admission Requirements:

- National Senior Certificate or National Certificate Vocational (with certificate pass);
- Matriculation Certificate or equivalent;
- Mature students (45 years or later) can be admitted, determined by the Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) conditions and the results of the National Benchmark Test (NBT)

What do I need to study the Bachelor of Theology?

Postgraduate Studies

(after you complete your degree):

Studying Bachelor of Theology majors

- A National Senior Certificate (NSC) with a bachelor's pass or equivalent;
- Matriculation Certificate (with university exemption) or equivalent;
- Higher Certificate or an Advanced Certificate or Diploma in a cognate field.

Alternative

- A National Senior Certificate or National Certificate Vocational with a diploma pass (or equivalent) combined with the results of the NBT;
- Mature age of 23 and over during the first year of studies and a National Senior Certificate (or equivalent);
- RPL policy for access and the results of the NBT are determining factors for admission. Contact the admissions office regarding RPL;
- Mature students (45 years or later) can be admitted, determined by the RPL conditions and the results of the NBT.
