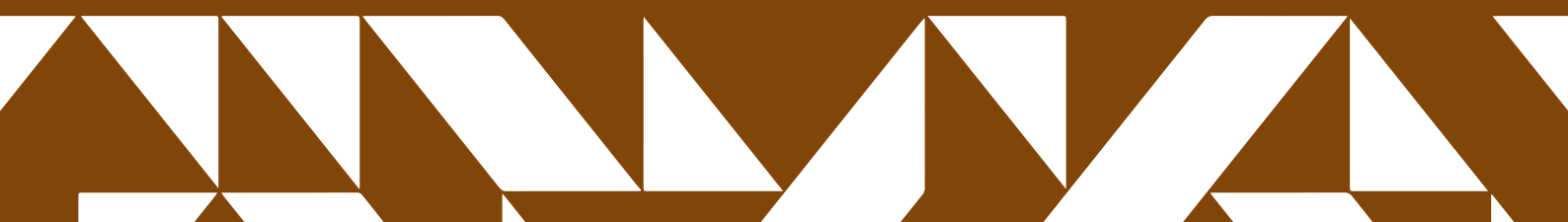

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

The Higher Certificate in Community Development is targeted at:

- Individuals, volunteers, and practitioners interested in pursuing a career in Community Development
- Individuals working in Community Development or are interested in community development as a career path but do not have a bachelor's matric pass
- Completion of the Higher Certificate in Community Development lays the basis for you to apply for the BA in Community Development to pursue a further qualification

(Minimum 2 years; maximum 3 years; 122 credits; NQF 5)
Mode of delivery: Contact and Distance (as per CHE concession)**

Admission requirements

- A National Senior Certificate or National Certificate Vocational (certificate pass)
- A Matriculation Certificate or equivalent
- Mature age of 45 years can be admitted, determined by the Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) portfolio of evidence provided

Programme-specific outcomes

Students who have completed the qualification should be able to:

- Apply effective leadership and management principles in community development projects.
- Explain and evaluate community development challenges, and community development approaches to rural and urban poverty among poor and marginalised communities.
- Identify key role players and resources in communities and identify strategies for mobilising communities and resources.
- Identify and apply best-practice community participatory development methods for specific development projects facilitate development initiatives and support community development projects.
- Develop monitoring and evaluation processes and frameworks for community project analysis, evaluation and impact assessment.
